DAY 1 | LET THERE BE LIGHT

As Pastor Jonathan was praying into the new year, he felt the Lord impress that 2024 was "The Year of Light." Let's dig in and see what God has in store for us as we put Him first and seek His heart for our lives and community this year.

When we look at the Word of God, we see that the first recorded words that God said were "Let there be light." And there was. Light is a powerful thing. It does not fight with the darkness around it, it simply dispels it. It illuminates what is already there, making things visible. These four words spoken by God teach us so much. They show us what He values. And it shows us the power of His words. Today, lets begin to ask the Lord to do a work in our hearts regarding the power and validity of His spoken words - because we are about to dive into some of the impactful words He has spoken over you and your life over the next 21 days.

Genesis 1:1-3 – In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. 2 Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters. 3 And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, thank you for your Word and for your light. Today I ask that you would begin to light up my heart. Shine into every corner, every hidden thing; illuminate and dispel the darkness. Give me greater wisdom and clarity to understand the power of your Word - the truth that when you speak something, it will come to pass! I am seeking a touch from you. Transform my mind and thinking this year! In Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 2 | THE WORD

John 1:1-2 – In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made.

Interestingly enough, John 1:1 opens with the same three words that Genesis 1:1 does: "In the beginning." John then goes on to say that the 'Word' was with God. So then, who is the Word? Who was with and equal to God? At this point in the chapter, all we know is that John was pointing out that the "Word" was present with God in the beginning. However, as we read further into the chapter we see that, in verse 14, it says "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth."

We know that the Word who became flesh is Jesus. He is God in human form. When we put Genesis 1 and John 1 together we begin to realize that Jesus was present at Creation and from the beginning. Genesis 1:2 says that the Holy Spirit was also present "hovering over the waters." So why does this matter? It matters because it points to the eternal and everlasting power and presence of God and His Word. It reminds us that God's Word is different from ours. It is living, it is moving. It is taking on human form for us. It reminds us that everything is in Him and to Him, that it is in Him that we live and move and have our being. Everything points to Him.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, today I pause to recognize who you are and the extravagant power of your presence and your word. I ask that you would expand my thinking and help me to see what you see. Help me to see everything from your perspective and through your grace, wisdom, and sovereignty. I love you and honor you today Jesus. Amen.

DAY 3 | LIFE

John 1:3-4 – tpt And through his creative inspiration this Living Expression made all things, for nothing has existence apart from him! Life came into being because of him, for his life is light for all humanity.

In Aramaic, this word 'life' actually translates to 'lives.' It is not only referring to multiple human lives, but it also points to the truth that in Him there is life of every form - spiritual, emotional, physical, and relational. Our life is established in God's Word. The life he has given us is not intended to be a 'get by' life or a 'barely breathing' life. Our souls are intended to prosper! Our mind, will, and emotions, our bodies and beings. Our spirits are made to flourish and live in His Kingdom. The Word says that the Kingdom of God is righteousness, peace, and joy. Our very life is found in Him! The richness of our lives comes from constant connection and relationship with the Life Giver.

Prayer:

Father God, I recognize that in you and through you are all things. I acknowledge you as the author of all things and the finisher of all of that you begin. I crown you as King in my heart and life today. I hold you higher than everything else. Thank you for life - for the opportunity to live in peace and thrive in every way. We ask for more of your life to invade our lives, our families, our homes, our relationships, and our communities! We love you. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 4 | LIGHT

John 1:5-9 – The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light. The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world.

Light is dynamic. It is, in and of itself, an anecdote to darkness. Sometimes we can forget this truth and spend too much time and energy fighting and fearing darkness. The enemy has come to fill our lives with darkness. He tries to keep us trapped in it. But Jesus is light! He has come that we may not be overcome with evil but to overcome evil with good.

Prayer:

Dear God, thank you for your light that overcomes any darkness I face. Thank you for letting me have access to your light through the price that Jesus paid. I pray that you would help me walk in your wisdom and discernment. Help me recognize the power of the light I carry because you are with me. Help me to shine your light everywhere I go and help me to remove anything in my life that may be hindering that light from shining through me. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 5 UNAWARE

John 1:10-11 tpt – He entered into the very world he created, yet they were unaware. He came to the very people he created, to those who should have recognized him, but they did not receive him.

Jesus was misunderstood on many levels, but he did not allow it to stop him from being everything God created him to be. He was fully God and fully man, yet his very creation didn't realize who he was. There were even people trying to trap and disqualify him while he was doing what his Father asked him of him. Because of the trust he had in his Father's great plan, he did not give up. When Jesus died on the cross, he did it for people everywhere - anyone who would choose to receive the gift of salvation. That means he bought the potential salvation of the very people who crucified him. He proved His heart by showing compassion in real time. He prayed "Father forgive them, they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34).

As we walk through this journey of being transformed into the image of Christ, it is important that we walk with our head held high. We need to live in who God created us to be. Like Jesus, we need to pour out grace and mercy, kindness and forgiveness in real time. As we do, we will begin to be known by our love, just as Jesus is.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, transform me with your light. Keep me humble and at your feet when I find myself in places where I am misunderstood and mistreated. Help me to pray for my enemies and shine my light in the darkness of this world. Thank you for your grace and mercy in my life - help me to receive it fully and give it away to the people around me. I love you. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 6 | AUTHORITY

John 1:12-13 tpt — But those who embraced him and took hold of his name were given the authority to become the children of God. He was not born by the joining of human parents or from natural means, or by a man's desire, but he was born of God.

Those who had ears to hear, and a heart to receive the message of the gospel, accepted the truth of who Jesus is. That decision transformed their lives and eternities. Becoming a child of God is to receive a gift that we could never obtain or accomplish on our own. We all fall short of the perfect life needed to earn an eternity in heaven. But we can receive Jesus' perfect life that he laid down for us. That gift gives us access to the abundant life that was born not of man, but of God.

The Bible says that when we embrace Jesus for ourselves, we receive the authority to become His child. We are adopted and grafted into the Family of God. That means that you belong. You have a heavenly inheritance. You have the right to walk in the truth of who God is and in the redemption of Jesus' sacrifice on the cross.

Prayer:

God, teach me to walk in and truly understand the authority you have given me through your Son. Help me to accept the gift of salvation and the gift of being your son or daughter. Help me to understand the inheritance and blessing I now walk in. Help me to think of and include others along the way. I love you and honor you today. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 7 | THE LIVING EXPRESSION

John 1:14 – And so the Living Expression became a man and lived among us! And we gazed upon the splendor of his glory, the glory of the One and Only who came from the Father overflowing with tender mercy and truth.

This is the fulfillment of Isaiah 7:14, where it says "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel." Immanuel, meaning 'God with us,' is Jesus Christ living among his people. There is no greater gift than the gift of salvation - the gift of God sending His only Son.

The example of Christ shows us how to live and commune with God. He shows us how to forgive, love others, and how to walk in integrity. The list goes on and on. Today, take a little extra time in the Word, perhaps in one of the gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, or John) and see what the Holy Spirit wants to teach you personally from the life of Jesus. As you read, be aware and sensitive to the things that are being highlighted or are speaking to you in a new way.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, thank you for the gift of your Son. Thank you for His sacrifice on the cross and the example he set here on earth. Thank you for loving me so deeply and extravagantly that you would prepare a way for me, even 2000 years later. Thank you for the blueprint for how to live a life that honors You. You are worthy of my time and my pursuit of hearing directly from you. I love you. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 8 | NEVER ALONE

Psalm 139:7-12 — Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there. If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast. If I say, "Surely the darkness will hide me and the light become night around me," even the darkness will not be dark to you; the night will shine like the day, for darkness is as light to you.

There is truly no place we can go to hide from His presence. He is always near. If you look back on the moments when you felt the most alone, you will surely see that God was present; he was near. Psalm 139 gives us peace in knowing that we serve a God far greater than ourselves. Nothing escapes Him - not even the small details of your life. Take a moment today to look for God in the details. See if you can find Him in your interactions today - perhaps in a smile or a gentle word spoken in the right moment.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, thank you for your steadfast nearness. Thank you that you love us and never give up on us or grow weary of our humanity. Today, make me more aware of your nearness. Help me to see you working in the details of my life. Help me to see the needs of others and you working in their lives too. I am grateful that I can trust your timing and your direction. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 9 | NOTHING HIDDEN

Hebrews 4:12-13 – For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart. Nothing in all creation is hidden from God. Everything is naked and exposed before his eyes, and he is the one to whom we are accountable.

For more clarity, the Passion Translation says it this way:

Hebrews 4:12-13 tpt – For we have the living Word of God, which is full of energy, like a two-mouthed sword. It will even penetrate to the very core of our being where soul and spirit, bone and marrow meet! It interprets and reveals the true thoughts and secret motives of our hearts. There is not one person who can hide their thoughts from God, for nothing that we do remains a secret, and nothing created is concealed, but everything is exposed and defenseless before his eyes, to whom we must render an account.

We serve a good God. A God that can be trusted fully with everything. He is not the type of parent you need to run or hide from. He is not watching our every move so he can 'catch us.' He is watching because He loves us and is looking out for us. He is looking for any and every opportunity to pour out a blessing on us. He wants to lead us to the fullness that He has in store for us. He is the kind of dad that is cheering us on, ready to cover us in our weakness, and pick us up after we fall. He is present and ready to walk with us through whatever situation we find ourselves in. He is overflowing with kindness. Always.

Prayer:

Father, thank you for your kindness. Thank you for being the kind of Father I never need to run or hide from. Thank you for loving me and being willing to meet me exactly where I am. Thank you that there is no fear in loving you. Thank you for loving and accepting me exactly the way I am and for loving me enough not to leave me that way. You are good and you are kind. Today I choose to take a new step in trusting you. Although you already know all things, today I choose to open up to you about the things we have never talked about. I long for your direction and correction in every area of my life. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 10 | WALKING IN LIGHT

1 John 1:5-7 – This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. If we claim to have fellowship with him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live out the truth. But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.

The Bible is very clear about God's desire for us to walk in light. In fact, this scripture is an even higher call. It is a self-check. An opportunity for us to look in the mirror of scripture and check our hearts. Are we claiming to have fellowship with him yet walking in darkness? We know that the enemy of our soul loves to work in the darkness. He does his best work in hiddenness and isolation. But if we choose to live in the light, we are purified from all sin and free from anything that the enemy wants to throw at us.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, search my heart. Know me. Find anything in me that is not pleasing to you so that I may offer it up to you. Thank you that you do powerful work in our hearts. Thank you that I am not left on my own to deal with my shortcomings. Today, I surrender to you each and every area of my life. Come and do a mighty work of transformation and growth - all for your glory. I love you and trust you. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 11 | HUMILITY

As humans, it can be far easier to ignore the areas of our lives where we fall short. Instead we spend our time focusing on and reinforcing the areas of our lives where we believe we are succeeding. While it is great to have areas where we are doing well, it is often said that we are only as sick as our secrets. That includes our secret sins and our undisclosed issues.

1 John 1:8 – If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.

We all fall short. We are all in need of grace. These truths have the opportunity to point in the direction of humility. Today, let's allow these truths to lead us straight to that place. Humility grants us access to His faithfulness and justice. It allows us to have the sweet gift of forgiveness and freedom.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, keep me humble and at your feet. God, help me to recognize my need for you. Help me to see others the way you see them and help me be willing to admit when and where I am wrong. Search me and know me, Jesus. Remove anything in me that is not pleasing or glorifying to you. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 12 | SHINE

Matthew 5:16 – In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.

We were made to shine. For those of us that grew up singing Sunday school songs, we know that 'this little light of mine' is something that the world needs. It is something that the world longs for. If we can grasp this simple task, we can transform our community with the light of Christ. Light overcomes darkness. We aren't tasked with creating the light, God has already done that. We simply need to let it out!

This is why surrender matters. We need to allow Him to remove the stuff that the world piles onto us. As we do, we become a clearer vessel for his light to shine through. Too often we get caught in the trap of wanting the credit. But this verse in Matthew is so clear. We are to let our light shine so that others may experience the light of Christ and He receives the glory He is so worthy of.

Prayer:

Father, help me to shine for you. God, receive the glory you are so worthy of from the depths and the heights of my life! Thank you that I don't have to strive to be good; only to surrender to your will. Keep transforming me into your image, for your glory! I love you. I choose to let you shine through me. Lead me today. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 13 | FATHER OF LIGHTS

James 1:17 – Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows.

Shadows can be deceiving. Depending on the angle of the light, shadows can appear much bigger than the object actually is. That's why it's so important to take time every day to cleanse our mind in the Word. Getting into the presence of God reminds us who the Father of Lights is and that He never changes. It is so important that we continue our pursuit of knowing God and His character. The Bible is clear that God loves us. He has good plans for us. In fact, every good thing we have comes from him. He loves you more than you could ever comprehend.

Prayer:

Father, today I take time to honor and praise you for who you are. I can get to know you and trust that you will never ever change. You are infinitely good and you have good things in store for us. Help me remember that on the days I struggle to see your hand moving, I can still trust your heart. Give me wisdom to see and a mind to discern. I love you and long for more of you today. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 14 | RISE

Micah 7:8 – Do not gloat over me, my enemy! Though I have fallen, I will rise. Though I sit in darkness, the LORD will be my light.

Following Christ does not make us exempt from pain or realities of the fallen world we live in. But it does make us free from its eternal destruction. Though we fall, we get back up. Though we fail temporarily, we are sure to succeed in the end.

Jesus didn't come so we would never endure pain. He came so that we might have life! The truth is that sin, or 'missing the mark,' has its own consequences. Often those consequences include pain and discomfort of our own doing. It is also true that some of life's greatest lessons come from seasons of pain. When we mess up, we can still trust in God. We can look for what lesson we can learn from it. We can watch how God works it together for our good. We can also take that opportunity to pray and wait in full confidence that God will make a way for us.

Never underestimate the love and power of our Father. Never count God's kids out. He will always rescue His people and bring them back to hope in the end.

Prayer:

Father, thank you for loving me enough to be with me in my pain and discomfort. Thank you for never leaving me and never giving up on me. I know that in this life I may experience hardship, challenges and even failures. Thank you that you are there through it all, ready and waiting to bring me the rescue I need. Help me to grow in my confidence of who you are in my life and to trust the process of growth and redemption! In Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 15 | REVELATION LIGHT

Luke 11:33-36 tpt – No one would think of lighting a lamp and then hiding it in the basement where no one would benefit. A lamp belongs on a lampstand, where all who enter may see its light. The eyes of your spirit allow revelation-light to enter into your being. When your heart is open the light floods in. But when your heart is hard and closed, the light cannot penetrate and darkness takes its place. Open your heart and consider my words. Watch out that you do not mistake your opinions for revelation-light! If your spirit burns with light, fully illuminated with no trace of darkness, you will be a shining lamp, reflecting rays of truth by the way you live.

We have a job to do. If we want to live with the revelation light of Jesus, we must keep our hearts open. We must make sure that we do not mistake our opinions for revelation light. It can be easy to allow pride to creep in and pull us off track. Oftentimes, the enemy tries to move us into a closed-off heart posture. This is where we have to be wise. We need to check our hearts often to ensure that we are operating out of humility and keeping our eyes open to the revelation light we vitally need.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, keep me humble and at your feet. Keep my heart soft and open toward you. Help me to guard my heart against the enemy's plan to use unforgiveness, strife, bitterness, or shame to harden my heart. Help my spirit to burn with light, be fully illuminated and to reflect the truth by the way I live. I want my life to shine for you. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 16 OUR STRONGHOLD

Psalm 27:1 – The LORD is my light and my salvation— whom shall I fear? The LORD is the stronghold of my life— of whom shall I be afraid?

This scripture was written by David before he was anointed king. What a powerful heart posture. David knew who God was to him. Although he saw very tangible reasons to fear, he declared truth over his life, mind, and situation. David then cries out to God and declares the truth of the light of his salvation:

Psalm 27:2-4 tpt

When the evil ones come to destroy me,

They will be the ones who turn back.

My heart will not be afraid even if an army rises to attack.

I know that you are there for me, so I will not be shaken.

Here's the one thing I crave from God,

The one thing I seek above all else:

I want the privilege of living with him every moment in his house,

Finding the sweet loveliness of his face,

Filled with awe, delighting in his glory and grace.

I want to live my life so close to him

That he takes pleasure in my every prayer.

Prayer:

Father God, in the midst of whatever I am facing in my life today, I choose to remember that you are my salvation, my light, and the stronghold of my life. I choose to declare that if you are for me, there is no reason to fear. God, I pray that I would crave more of you, more time in your presence, more nearness with you. Father, do a mighty work in my heart and knit my heart closer to you. I love you and long for you in Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 17 UNSEEN

2 Corinthians 4:17-18 – For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us and eternal glory that far outweighs them all. So we fix our eyes not on what is seen but what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal.

God's word trumps all others. All opinions, beliefs, comments, feelings, misconceptions, judgments, and even earthly 'realities'. It is easy to become overwhelmed by difficulties, problems, and tragedies that come our way. But when we get in the Word, we can contrast our earthly struggles in the light of eternity, the depth of God's love, and the truth of who we are. These are the moments that the enemy tries to creep in and challenge our faith. The Bible tells us that the Word cleanses us, challenges us, and lights up our path. When we bring all things to God and allow Him to have the final say, we declare our obedience. We choose in those painful moments that we will worship anyway. We will praise before it makes sense. We will honor and trust God in the storm. We fix our eyes on what is unseen and stand on the truth that it will result in eternal glory. Walk in wisdom today and let Him decide what is important. Let Him light your path and give you a heavenly perspective. He is good and He is trustworthy.

Prayer:

Father, help me to see like you see. God give me your perspective and help me to remember that you are my Father, provider, protector, healer, and strong tower. No matter what I face, please help my faith in you, and my active obedience to surpass it all. Help me to be aware of when I am fixing my eyes on what is seen. Help me to keep my eyes on you and my mind rooted in the truth of your Word. I trust you today, in Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 18 ONLY LIGHT

John 1:5 – *The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.*

There is a famous quote by Martin Luther King Jr that says, "Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that." It points to the truth that without the Light {God} we are hopeless because the things of this world are not powerful enough to drive out the darkness. Only light can do that.

Here at Rez we talk a lot about the power of light and getting things out of the dark. We know that the enemy of our souls does his best work in the private places of our minds where no one else is around. Pastor Mike Olson often reminds us that "light" is often people. It is letting others into our messes so that the enemy can't have his way in the darkness. When he is exposed he is no longer able to deceive us.

In the same way we learn our way around our house in the dark, we can often get pretty comfortable with the dark places in our lives. Until something unexpected is left out and we trip or get hurt. This is where people can help us see the piles or messes we are in the habit of stepping over. Darkness is real and it comes in all shapes and sizes. But never discount the power of the light you carry. Regardless of what the enemy tries to convince you of, the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness cannot overcome it!

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, help us to be people of light! Help us to allow your light to shine through us as we walk through this dark world: lighting up every plan the enemy has to hold us back from your freedom and life! Help us to fully know and understand the power of your light. Let us never fear or be overcome by darkness but to overcome evil with your light! In Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 19 LIGHT OF THE WORLD

John 8:12 – When Jesus spoke again to the people, he said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

Jesus tells us here that He is the light of the world. A flashlight is not useful or necessary in a room that is already lit up. Jesus came for a purpose - to bring light to the darkness in this world. It isn't hard to see that evil exists in this world. Jesus came so that we may have life and life in abundance! Whoever follows him will never walk in darkness. Following takes attention and intentionality. What steps or habits can you take this week to follow that light? Do you have time set aside for just you and Jesus? Spend some time in worship and prayer this week. The light makes life worth living. Spend a little extra time soaking in that light today!

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, thank you for sending your son as the light of the world, the light of our lives. Thank you for giving us a way to succeed in a dark world. Thank you for your hope and direction. More than anything, help us to keep our hearts open and ready to move in the direction you point. We love you and trust you. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

DAY 20 | A ROYAL PRIESTHOOD

1 Peter 2:9 – But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light.

You are. Those are powerful words. There are stories and accounts of people who were very rich or had a massive inheritance but didn't know it. These stories show how they were looking for food or shelter and then found out that there was an inheritance waiting for them all along. The inheritance we have in Jesus is greater than we could ever imagine. It is impossible to fully grasp it on this side of heaven.
